SOP guides case plan modification when there are changes to the family composition or the household members for both in-home and out-of-home cases.

Some changes may include the birth of a child, the addition of a parent paramour, the addition of extended relatives to the household, death, or divorce.

SOP guidance ensures that risk factors and safety threats brought about by these changes are known to the agency and account for the services in the family's case plan.



SOP 3.13 provides procedures and practice guidance regarding case planning and case plan modification.

SOP 4.18 provides additional guidance regarding case plan modification when there is a change in the family composition, such as a trial home visit.
