1. **Comment:** How often should staff be taking pictures?

This says a recent photograph, we feel you should add how often a picture should be taken and uploaded.

Response: Additional information has been added to the Practice Guidance section.

The SSW should photograph the child during each monthly face-to-face contact with the child. (Please see [SOP C7.21 SSW's Ongoing Contact with the Family, Including the Medically Complex Child](#)). The photo should be uploaded into the child's case record.

2. **Comment:** I think it is important to provide clarification in the SOP that for KAPE youth, if the youth is not comfortable with their photo being shared and does not sign the consent, the youth still must be referred to KAPE. A silhouette can be used on the website, but that may impact recruitment efforts. Therefore, I also think the SOP should include information that if the KAPE youth does not feel comfortable sharing their photo, the worker will collaborate with the youth's treatment team to develop a plan to address and work through the youth's feelings in therapy and throughout the youth's treatment. Permanency planning should always be a component of the youth's treatment.

Response: Additional information has been added to Contingencies and Clarifications.

For youth who do not consent to their photograph's use on KAPE, a silhouette may be used in lieu of a photograph on their profile. In these cases, the SSW should collaborate with the youth's treatment team to develop a plan to address and work through the youth's feelings in therapy and throughout treatment. Permanency planning should always be a component of the youth's treatment.
