Did you know - Making a finding

Did You Know?

Did you know that there is a significant difference between a finding of substantiated and a finding of found and substantiated? Found and substantiated findings are used only for maltreatment that was not reported to our agency, but was instead identified during the course of the investigation. Child Abuse and Neglect data is reported to the federal government so it is important that we capture not only the different types of maltreatment, but also the most appropriate type of finding in the referral results screen in twist.
