FINDINGS RECOMMENDATIONS

When considering the finding of maltreatment, the SSW and FSOS will decide through consultation if the child was found to be an "Abused or neglected child" per KRS 600.020. The assessment of maltreatment will need to support the legal rational in the narrative of the ADT.
